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Pre-Surgery Eye Drop Instruction

Start Cyclogyl 1% (the one with the red cap) on the morning of surgery. Take 1 drop every 5 minutes for fifteen minutes (3 applications). Then take 1 more drop (the 4th application) before leaving your home and heading to the surgery center. (Keep this medication at home; you can use the same bottle for your other eye if it needs surgery too.) Remember, Cyclogyl is only to be used *before* surgery.

Post-Surgery Eye Drop Instruction

- 1. After surgery, begin using Tobradex (Tobramycin-Dexamethasone) in the operated eye, 1 eye drop, 4 times per day (breakfast, lunch, dinner and bedtime). Close your eyelids for 2 to 3 minutes after instillation to have the medication better absorb into your eye. Tobradex is to be used for 7 to 14 days (use it until you run out). If you run out in less than 7 days, you will need to buy more. The surgery center *may* provide you with one bottle.
- 2. Use ketorolac (or the prescribed NSAID), 1 eye drop, 4 times-a-day in the operated eye for 2 weeks (4 weeks if you have a retinal problem as discussed with your eye surgeon). Multiple refills are provided in case of extended use.
- 3. Remember to continue all other eye drops as usual. This is especially true if you are using glaucoma eye drops.
